

Dial Hewlett, Jr., MD, FACP, FIDSA

Dr. Hewlett, is currently Medical Director, Division of Disease Control, Chief of Tuberculosis Services, Westchester Department of Health.

Dr. Hewlett received his MD from the University of Wisconsin, Madison Wisconsin and is board certified in Internal Medicine and in the subspecialty of Infectious Diseases. He served an internal medicine internship and residency at Harlem Hospital Center – Columbia University College of Physicians & Surgeons in New York City. He was also selected to serve an additional year as Chief Medical resident in Internal medicine at Harlem Hospital Center.
