

Patrick O'Shaughnessy, DO, MBA, MS-POPH, CHCQM, FACEP, is Catholic Health Services of Long Island's (CHS) executive vice president for medical affairs and system chief clinical officer (CCO). Dr. O'Shaughnessy areas of expertise include high reliability clinical operations as a platform for enhancing quality, patient safety and financial performance, population health management, medical informatics, service line development and clinical network growth and maturation. He is a recognized leader in high reliability health care and has published and speaks nationally on patient safety, population health, effective team building and leadership, multiple domain and scenario based learning, and quality improvement processes in health care.

Dr. O'Shaughnessy completed his residency in emergency medicine at Albert Einstein College of Medicine at Beth Israel where he was selected to be chief resident and then was offered faculty appointment at Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Dr. O'Shaughnessy was promoted to Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine and was a practicing emergency attending physician at Beth Israel Medical Center for over 10 years, It was during this time at Beth Israel where he cared for patients from all walks of life, and most importantly further developed his true "humanistic" philosophy and approach to practicing medicine and helped dozens of young physicians learn these same skills. It was here that he also led disaster and recovery efforts for the September 11th attacks on the World Trade Center.

Dr. O'Shaughnessy earned his medical degree from New York College of Osteopathic Medicine and his master's in business administration from Adelphi University and a second master's degree in Population Health Management from Thomas Jefferson University. He is board certified in emergency medicine and health care quality and management. Dr. O'Shaughnessy has applied the concepts of military and commercial aviation high reliability science to his healthcare systems clinical operations to the benefit of thousands of patients and has successfully reduced patient harm events across the entire \$3B healthcare system. He has also been very passionate about working to positively impact health care disparities as well as the heroin and prescription drug epidemic that has plagued Long Island. In this capacity, he has served on the Suffolk County Heroin and Prescription Opiate Task Force which helped to frame legislative recommendations for Suffolk County officials. He also provided key legislative testimony to Governor Cuomo's taskforce on Heroin and Prescription Drug Abuse last year at Farmingdale College.

Dr. O'Shaughnessy has been married to his wife Mia for over 15 years meeting in the aftermath of 9-11. He and his wife Mia have been blessed with one daughter Brooke, who is a passionate student and competitive figure skater.
