

David Rosenthal, DO, PhD

David Rosenthal, DO, PhD, is the medical director for both the Center for Young Adult Adolescent and Pediatric HIV (CYAAPH) and for the Center for Transgender Care at Northwell Health. In addition to focusing on care of adolescents and young adults living with HIV, Rosenthal has been addressing LGBTQ inclusion in health care, and HIV prevention. He has opened a satellite clinic at Pride for Youth in Long Island providing low threshold medical care including screening for HIV Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP). As the founding medical director for the Center for Transgender Care, he coordinates care for transgender and gender non-conforming individuals, in collaboration with clinicians from internal medicine, pediatrics, OB/GYN, psychiatry, urology and surgery service lines at Northwell Health. He is also working with the Office of Diversity and Inclusion to develop a LGBT curriculum for Northwell Health. He is leading an IT transformation project to include sexual orientation and gender identity information in the health system's data framework. In addition to practicing clinical medicine, Rosenthal performs translational research at the Feinstein Institute for Medical Research, studying immune responses to viruses and use of technology in health care, and he also is working on outcomes-based research for patients living with HIV and for the LGBT community. Rosenthal is an assistant professor of medicine and pediatrics at Donald and Barbara School of Medicine at Hofstra/Northwell.

Evelina Grayver, MD FACC

Dr. Evelina Grayver is an attending cardiologist and Director of Women's Heart Health at Katz Institute for Women's Health at the Sandra Atlas Bass Heart Hospital at North Shore University Hospital (NSUH). Dedicated to empowering women to take control of their heart health, she focuses on preventative cardiac care, preeclampsia-associated heart issues, and cardiac care for high-risk pregnancy and postpartum cardiomyopathy patients. Her commitment to cardio-obstetrics yielded a multidisciplinary program founded in partnership with an MFM colleague. A graduate of Downstate Medical Center who completed her training at NSUH, Dr. Grayver is board certified in Cardiovascular Disease and Internal Medicine.

Dr. Victor Klein is currently a Perinatologist in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at North Shore University Hospital while serving as the Vice Chair of Obstetrics & Gynecology at North Shore University Hospital and the System Director of Quality & Patient Safety for the Ob Gyn Service Line at Northwell Health. Dr. Klein has been engaged in risk management and patient safety for over 30 years, and has lectured extensively on these fields throughout the country, including the ASHRM annual meeting. Dr. Klein received his medical degree from the State University of New York at Brooklyn/Downstate Medical School. He completed his internship at Kings County Hospital Center, residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at The Johns Hopkins Hospital, fellowships in Maternal-Fetal Medicine and Medical Genetics at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Dallas, and his MBA in Quality Management at Hofstra University. He is board certified in medical genetics, general obstetrics & gynecology, and maternal fetal medicine, has obtained CPHRM certification, and is recognized as a Fellow of the American Society for Health Care Risk Management. Dr. Klein has been a member of the editorial board and past editor of the Journal of Healthcare Risk Management, is on the Board of Directors for AHRMNY, a past board member for ASHRM, and is on the AHA Maternal & Child Health Council.
